SUMMER INSTITUTE PROGRAMS



Words Alive For children entering SK & grade 1, Words Alive is designed to further build literacy skills. Activities include: chants, music, games, guided reading sessions, and word hunts, balanced with recreational activities such as music, soccer, field games, drama, arts & crafts and computer publishing.

Clubhouse For children entering grades 2 & 3, Clubhouse provides opportunities for children to participate in a full day program designed exclusively for this age group. This program has a focus on theme related literacy activities balanced with recreational activities that include: soccer, volleyball, arts & crafts, computer publishing, ball hockey and much more!

Skills 'n Motion Level 1 NEW! For youth entering grades 4 & 5, this program has both an intentional literacy focus and an opportunity to participate in a variety of engaging and fun elective activities in athletics, arts and recreation. We all know how much kids enjoy mysteries! Participants will refine their reading and writing skills through daily immersion in fiction and fact mystery books and will put their sleuth knowledge to use by publishing a fact or fiction mystery story of their own on the computer!

Junior For youth entering grades 4 & 5 we offer quite a variety of options. Youth will participate in different skilled electives that are chosen from a list of many engaging and fun activities.

Skills 'n Motion Level 2 NEW! For youth entering grades 6, 7 & 8, this program has both an intentional literacy focus and an opportunity to participate in a variety of engaging and fun elective activities in athletics, arts and recreation. SI Roving Reporters will investigate the language of reporting and publish a weekly "In Touch" newsletter.

Junior High For youth entering grades 6, 7, 8 & 9, our Junior High participants will have the opportunity to take part in activities of their choice. These are chosen from a list of activities geared to build on skills already achieved.

Junior Pro For youth entering grades 6, 7, 8 & 9, Junior Pro participants have an excellent opportunity to go out into the community to take part in a wide array of activities. In the morning the youth will be involved in a variety of elective options. The afternoon has an off site community based component, which provides an opportunity for participants to experience wonderfully engaging activities.

Creative Design Are you ready to learn how to use a sewing machine to make your own creations? Join us for this fun introduction to sewing!

Urban Biking Interested in learning how to maintain a bike? Want to know the rules for the road? Then come biking with us through the community; we'll lead the way! This elective is not recommended for beginner bikers.



SUMMER INSTITUTE ELECTIVE ACTIVITIES

Archery Learn to sight along the bridge of your nose and feel the wind in the feathers of arrows when firing at bull's eyes in the archery field.

Basketball An emphasis on basketball fundamentals is provided: ball handling and dribbling, fast breaks, lay-ups, passing, rebounding, setting screens, and zone defense.

Dance Get up, join in, and groove to the music! Guests will enjoy a week full of the latest music while they learn and perform cool dance moves in the SI dance studio.

Digital Photography Attention all photographers! This is your opportunity to learn and develop your skills in digital photography! Learn how to capture and manipulate images with the latest digital cameras and Adobe Photoshop.

Fine Arts We take great pride in the extensive visual arts programs available at SI. Participants may explore their creative possibilities. Whether your child is a gifted artist or simply delights in experimenting, there is something for everyone. Good feelings grow with a sense of accomplishment.

Girls' World What is this anyway? It's fun stuff like manicures, making bracelets and lockets and much more!

Green Thumbs Learn the basics of gardening through hands on activities in our teaching garden.

Guitar Stars Learn how to be a real guitar hero. An introduction to basic cords and techniques will impress your family and friends.

Martial Arts Learn the foundation skills of this sport. Light contact competitions are held between participants with proper training.

Ready, Set, Cook Continues to offer the basics of food preparation and cooking. Participants will eat their daily creations and take home a recipe book at the end of each session

Scrapbooking Do you want to display pictures of your friends and family in a cool way? In this program participants will learn the creative art of combining pictures, memories and stories in one amazing album. Campers will have the option of bringing in pictures of their own or taking pictures at camp using digital cameras.

Simple Machines "Give me a lever and a place to stand and I can move the world!" You will design and build various simple machines and models that will roll, float and shoot. Take your models home at the end of each session.

Skateboarding Participants won't believe what expert instructors can do! Learn to drop in on the SI pipe, slide the rails, and practice ollies in the skate park.

Soccer "Pass, shoot and score!" In this elective, participants will make use of a variety of training equipment to take their soccer skills to the next level.

Tennis Game set, match! Grab a racquet and get on the court! You will learn the elements of the game of tennis - serving, rallying, how to score, and to play singles or doubles.
